Reinhard is an Associate Professor  
of English and Comparative Litera-  
ture at UCLA. He is an expert in early  
modern English literature, Shakespeare,  
psychoanalysis, Jewish studies, and criti-  
cal theory. He is the author, with Slavoj  
Zizek and Eric Santner of *The Neighbor:  
Three Inquiries in Political Theology* (U.  
of Chicago Press, 2005), and with Ju-  
lia Reinhard Lupton, of *After Oedipus:  
Shakespeare in Psychoanalysis* (Cornell  
UP, 1993), as well as articles on Freud, La-  
can, Levinas, Henry James, Jewish Stud-  
ies, and the Bible. He has edited a special  
issue of *Jouvert: A Journal of Postcolo-  
nialism on Religion* with Julia Reinhard  
Lupton. Currently he is writing a book  
on the ethics of the neighbor in religion  
(Torah, Talmud, and Patristic writings),  
philosophy (Kant, Kierkegaard, Adorno,  
Rosenzweig, and Levinas), and psycho-  
analysis (Freud and Lacan) for Princeton  
University Press.
